Fundraising

It's Camp Card time again! I don't know about you, but I look forward to the opportunity to replenish my Scout's Passbook Account. For all you Philmont attendees, I have ordered enough Camp Cards for you to sell your way to Philmont. It can be done if you are diligent in selling. You may sell door to door and there are twice as many Camp Card Kroger sales slots this year as last year. If you are willing to travel a bit, I am willing to be there to help you sell. I have booked time slots so far, at four separate Kroger Stores this year; The Colony, Little Elm, Flower Mound and Keller. My VolunteerSpot emails will be out this weekend. Please note the location you have signed up for and please, should you have to cancel one, notify me by text or email immediately so that I can try to fill your spot. Kroger sales start the weekend of March 14th.

Camp Card door-to-door sales start Saturday, March 8th, while you are at Spring Break Camp. I will be in the parking lot on Tuesday March 11th when you return to start passing out your cards. Only parents can sign for the check out of your cards. If you are not available Tuesday at camp return, I will be available Tuesday night for check out as well. I will check out a set number of cards at a time. Once all are paid for, I can check out more cards to you. Do not bring your checked out cards to a Kroger Show and Sale because I will provide the cards to sell when you arrive. This year it is a 50/50 split for your Camp Card profits. Each Camp card costs \$5.00. \$2.50 goes to the Longhorn Council for plastic and printing and \$2.50 goes to your Scout Account. You may use these funds for use on whatever Scouting need you may have be it Philmont, camps, tents, books, clothing, gear etc. Just produce a receipt from any store for your Scouting related gear and you can get reimbursement from our Treasurer for your purchase(s). Scouts, we can do this! Let's make this the BEST CAMP CARD SALE EVER!

Aluminum Can Collections still continue! Please leave your Aluminum Can bags with (rinsed out not dirty cans) in front of the Red Troop Trailer or in the bed of Mr. Jeff's truck at all Scout meetings or events. PLEASE, no trash in the can bags as we get docked 10 pounds for every one piece of trash the recycler finds. As you recall, Aluminum Can recycling is what enabled you to purchase your new White Troop Trailer!

A Word from our Treasurer



We had a fabulous month in February. Our Troop had an outdoor meeting on 2/18 at Stewart Creek Park and a fun Cooking Merit Badge Campout at Sid Richardson Scout Ranch from 2/21-2/23. The most exciting news is that we had no outstanding balances from all Scouts by end of February. Thank you for your great support!

I would like to welcome all new Scouts and their parents who joined our Troop recently. Many of you have submitted applications and paid registration fees (\$25.50 for registration and \$12 for Boy's Life magazine). Our official registration for existing Scouts will be in March. Our Troop will cover registration fees for all current Scouts. "Boy's Life" magazine will be an optional choice with a payment (\$12) from each Scout. As we start a new year (recharter for next year, 4/2014-3/2015), I would like to share some Troop financial guidelines and payment options with you as a friendly reminder for both new and "current" Scouts.

- 1. Quarterly Dues: Current dues are \$15, due by the first Troop meeting in the following month: January, April, July and September. You are always welcome to pay a full year (\$60) in advance.
- 2. Monthly Campout Payments: The payment is due two weeks before the Campout week. We encourage all Scouts to sign up through our Troop website and your Patrol Leader so we can make proper arrangements for transportation.
- 3. Grub Fees: \$3/meal and additional \$1 for Cracker Barrel. The Troop will cover propane, charcoal and other necessities for cooking. However, if the camp site requires other fees like entrance, car/night or reservation fees, we will inform you the total cost in advance.
- 4. Summer Camp and Winter Camp: Many Scouts participate in these week long camps scheduled during Summer and Winter vacations and take advantage of many Merit Badge classes offered during these special times. For these two camps a deposit is normally requested in advance by the respective camp site. Our Outdoor Chair will have all information ready when the time comes.
- 5. Payment Methods: You can pay check, cash, and/or money from your Scouts' Passbook Accounts (PB) for all Scout related activities; dues, camping grub fee, Merit Badge College, Leadership Training, Scouts' apparel, just to name a few. Almost every Scout in our Troop has their own Passbook Account into which we deposit the money earned by Scouts from Fundraising activities such as Camp Cards and Popcorn sales. You also can "top up" your Scout's PB account at any time by cash or check to "Troop 226". The Troop Treasurer maintains Scout PB Accounts and sends account balances to parents through personal email by the end of each month. One of the advantages of using your Scout's PB convenience. When you need to pay for your Scout's activity, but can't make it to the meeting, you can simply drop me a line, I will take care of the rest.
- 6. Late Payments: We encourage all Scouts to pay their dues and activity fees on time. According to Troop policies, a Scout is required to be responsible for timely payment. If the payment is not received by the activity date, it could prevent the Scout from participating in the activity or advancing rank. All account balances are checked for "Good Standing" before granting a Board of Review (BOR) for Rank Advancement. This is another good reason for each Scout to have his own PB.
